Available Copy, snack & beverage vending machines are available in the Student Center for your convenience. All proceeds from the snack & beverage machines support student scholarships. There is also a copy machine available for student use in the Transfer Center, RN 147. For your convenience, *Go Print*, a system that works on computer lab printers and library copy machines, has been installed. Users purchase a card for \$1 with the \$.50 going to the cost of the card and the remaining \$.50 available for printing at LRC copy machines and in computer labs around campus. Copies are \$.10 each for 8.5 x 11 copies. These cards are reusable and a value of up to \$20 can be added to the card. Card dispensers are located on the main floor of the LRC and the Business Lab (B 151).
